- Senate Finance Budget Recommendations

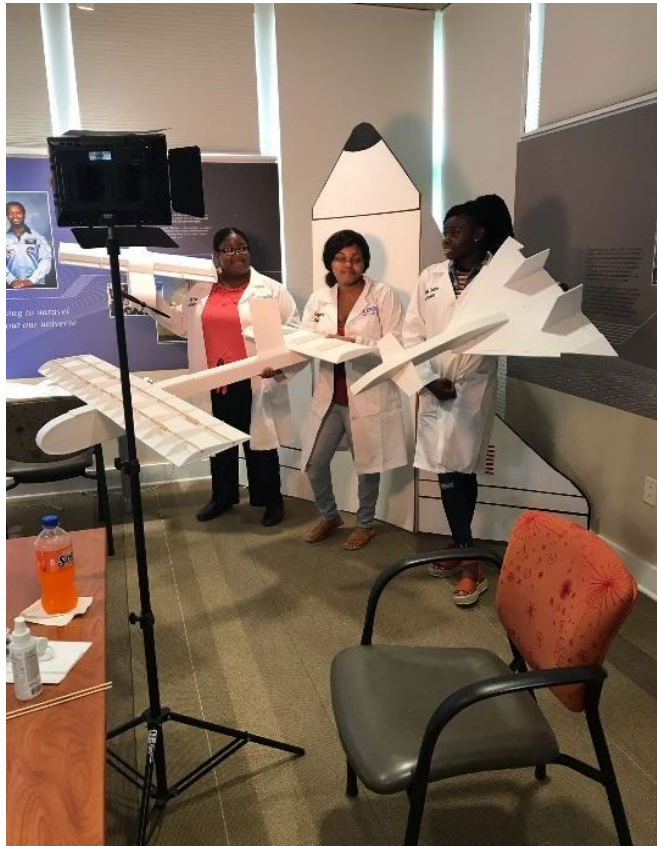
